The Board of Registered Nursing has set educational standards for nurse practitioner certification which must be met in order to "hold out" as a nurse practitioner. Nurse practitioners who meet the education standards and are certified by the BRN are prepared to provide primary health care, (CCR 1480 b), that

Nevada State Board of Nursing - Scope of Nursing Practice ...

Is the nurse prepared to accept accountability for the activity, task, function, intervention or role and for the related outcomes? The nurse may perform the activity, task, function, intervention or role to acceptable and prevailing standards of safe nursing care. STOP NOT within Scope of Practice. Not allowed by Nurse Practice Act. STOP
